Heritage Park is looking for Indigenous applicants interested in interpreting the history and culture of Treaty 7 First Nations for our many park visitors for the summer and fall season. If you love talking to people, telling stories and sharing your cultural heritage, this job is for you.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Educates and engages the public in the history, cultural traditions, and lifestyles of Treaty 7 First Nations during the late 1800s
- Works as part of a team of Indigenous Interpreters in period appropriate clothing at our tipi encampment portraying daily life in the buffalo days
- Demonstrates traditional activities, tools, and other materials
- Sets up and puts away artifacts and activity materials daily

Job Requirements:

- Comfortable sharing knowledge of Indigenous culture and speaking with visitors of all ages and backgrounds
- Experience speaking in front of groups; interpretive experience is a definite asset
- Knowledge of Treaty 7 First Nations history, culture, language, or traditional activities and skills

Hours of Work:

- Full-time hours available May to Labour Day, with weekend work during September and October (until Thanksgiving)
- Part-time hours also available throughout the season
