GENERAL STATEMENT OF POSITION:

Reporting to the Program Manager Prevention/Early Intervention, the Youth Prevention Team Lead is responsible for program development and provision of strategic leadership and direction to Youth Prevention team members, under the Prevention/Early Intervention umbrella within Siksika Children's Services. The Youth Prevention team will proactively connect youth to community supports and services through youth prevention plans, mandatory education series, elder support and youth prevention activities. The Youth Prevention Team Leader is accountable for a three (3) year work plan including program development, implementation, monitor and evaluation of program, case management of youth and on-going quality improvement initiatives.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED: Two (2) Youth Prevention Workers

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Responsible for Youth Prevention program development and integration of Siksika Ways of Knowing into all aspects of program delivery.
- Proactively engages early when involved with Youth; identifies preventative solutions to keep youth and families together and connected to community and culture.
- Develops and manages preventative policies and practice grounded in traditional healing measures; ensures practices are culturally safe, reflective of intergenerational impacts and trauma informed.
- Participates as a member of the Siksika Children's Services Prevention and Early Intervention leadership team and works collaboratively with SCS Protection Team Leads toward prevention of youth entering into care.
- Equip youth in care and in community with necessary skills and education on social/societal issues impacting their overall well-being.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

- Degree with acceptable specialization relevant to work performed or accepted combination of education, experience and knowledge.
- Knowledge of Siksika culture and traditions; Siksika Children Services history, impact and influence in community.
- Knowledge of the impact of Intergenerational Trauma due to colonialism, residential school history, sixties scoop and child welfare system on First Nation's people and communities.
